Mayor's Report

In my first reports to you, I laid out my leadership plan for the town. Now I want to share with you some of our concrete achievements during the past few months. These efforts are steppingstones to our long-term goals.

I want to stress that virtually every achievement below is also the product of the Town Council, town staff, and volunteers from the community. We are working together as a team, and we are moving forward as a town.

Cleaning Up

A visual blight on our town at the intersection of East-West Highway and Baltimore Avenue has been greatly improved. The property is owned by Potomac Development. After Eckerd Drug withdrew from the project, Potomac suspended work on the site for many months. Many of you answered my call to action, rallying at Town Hall to show Potomac Development the depth of our irritation over the "Field of Rubble." Within six short weeks, Potomac crushed the rubble, mixed in soil, seeded the lot, and removed the fence.

Building Relationships

There are five key property owners or developers with important projects affecting our town. We needed better relationships with each of them. From the day I became mayor, I have worked tirelessly to improve our interactions with

- Potomac Development
- University of Maryland's "M-Square" Enterprise Campus
- Douglas Development
- The owners of the Cafritz property on Baltimore Avenue
- Eakin Youngentob Associates

Finally, the town has positive relations with the major players in our economic development.

Beautification

Last year, the town received a Livability Grant to improve the appearance of our parks and public rights-of-way. Until I took office, the town staff had been kept out of the process of grant administration. After recognizing the problem, I worked with the staff and Anne Larson of the Beautification Committee to get the grant back on track. At this point, clear improvements have been made in most of our public spaces. More importantly, after the next growing season, the town will be a more beautiful place than it has been in years.

Public Safety

In June, when I began working with the council on the budget, one of the biggest issues we faced was keeping our police department wages competitive with other municipalities and the county. The importance of attracting and keeping an experienced police force can't be stressed enough. The council and I agreed to set aside a fund to increase wages and asked Police Chief Tom Parker to

standardize the pay scale. Chief Parker forwarded a plan to me in September. We reworked several drafts until the schedule met our requirements:

- To stay within the budget for this year
- To be affordable for next year and out to five years
- To make our force competitive with other municipalities
- To keep our police force from falling far behind the County Police on pay

I'm pleased that the council passed a resolution endorsing the scale during the November Legislative Meeting.

We need increased police presence along Kenilworth Avenue. Town staff and I met with business and property owners and agreed to make establishing a police substation along Kenilworth south of Riverdale Road a goal. Since that time, we have secured a commitment from the County Police Chief and the Department of State Police to help create and staff the station. A property owner has offered office space; we are submitting a grant request for funding. So many will benefit from this effort that I am confident the substation will become a reality during the next calendar year.

Economies of Scale

In a similar spirit of cooperation, Riverdale Park is working with Hyattsville on several projects. Our police force is looking into creating a common dispatching service, which would cut the cost of communications for both towns as well as facilitate the existing Mutual Aid Agreement, which provides for backup across town borders when needed.

In addition, we have jointly applied to the county for a grant to share a street sweeper—equipment that would significantly increase our ability to keep Riverdale Park clean.

Professionalism

It may surprise you to know that our town government was not holding regular meetings of senior staff when I took office. The regular senior staff meeting I instituted in July has already improved the management of the town. Meeting weekly with Town Administrator Prangley, Police Chief Parker, and Public Works Director Houser reinforces the chain of command, clarifies responsibilities, opens dialogue within management, and builds team spirit. We are seeing clear improvement in coordination of code enforcement issues, in oversight of our annual budget, and in planning for future improvements.

Holiday Celebrations

Let me wish everyone comfort and joy during the holiday season. I encourage you to make attending Riverdale Park's Festival of Lights a tradition in your family. This year the Riverdale Park Recreation Board is cosponsoring the festival with the Riverdale Business Association. Bring the kids to Town Hall for the Holiday Party and a picture with Santa on December 16th at 4:30 p.m. Stay for the festival—the first trolley leaves Town Hall at 7 p.m.!

Public Works Report

Public Works is closed on Mon., Dec. 26, 2005. Regular trash and yard-waste pickup for Area A will be on Tues., Dec. 27, 2005, and for Area B on Wed., Dec. 28, 2005. Public Works is closed on Mon., Jan. 2, 2006. Regular trash and yard-waste pickup for Area A will be on Tues., Jan. 3, 2006, and for Area B on Wed., Jan. 4, 2006. Public Works is closed on Mon., Jan. 16, 2006. Regular trash and yard-waste pickup for Area A will be on Tues., Jan. 17, 2006, and for Area B on Wed., Jan. 18, 2006.

Leaves

Please do not park vehicles on the street in front of leaf piles as they then cannot be collected. Do **not** rake leaves or deposit yard waste or other debris in the street or gutter as this is a municipal infraction that carries a fine of \$100. We ask residents to be patient: If you see the leafer has been on your block on any given day, it will be about 5 working days before the leafer will be back to that block. Loose-leaf collection ends Fri., Dec. 30, 2005. After that, leaves must be bagged and put out for yard waste.

Contacting Public Works During Emergencies

In extreme emergencies (i.e., snowstorms, hurricanes, etc.), resident calls for Public Works need to be routed to the Police Department (301-927-4343), which will contact us. Often Public Works staff is not available to answer the phones, but the Police Department has radio communication.

Parking During Snow Emergencies

New rule: Park only on even sides of streets unless otherwise posted.

Lights Out

It is important to Pepco that residents call and report that their electricity is out. This helps Pepco to better understand a widespread outage and to see where or what the problem may be. Please be patient when the number is constantly busy.
